
Recent Interact Club Projects



A Hands-On Anatomy Lesson In Science

Following the College examination period, Year 12 biology students along with Year 10 science students, had an opportunity to compare avian anatomy with their own. Dissection of chicken wings shows analagous features with our own limbs. Senior students then had the chance to practice their surgical skills with open heart surgery on sheep hearts. Tricuspid valve removal, repair, and reinsertion were attempted with varying degrees of success.
