
Sports: Things to Look forward to....

School transport services impacted by unavailability of drivers.

We apologise for the late notice to our parents but we have only received this from The School Transport Services this afternoon.

The <u>Covid-19 Public Health Response (Vaccinations) Amendment Order (No 3) 2021</u> mandated Covid-19 vaccinations for all drivers of school transport services funded by the Ministry of Education.

A School transport service for our school will not run from <u>Tuesday 16</u>th November until further notice. This is for Routes 1249 and 1100 which come from **Onerahi to Excellere** and return each day.

You will need to find alternative means of transport from 16th November.
