## This term's Memory verse:

Students who learn and recite all assigned memory verses (4 across the year) will earn a scripture memory ribbon and bar. This will be awarded at our end of year prize giving.

## The Big Idea:

# Information for Parents and Caregivers:

### School Hours:

Teachers are on site from 8:15am and classrooms are available for students from 8:30am. Year 1 and 2 students can be walked to their classroom down the designated path (please wear a mask).

<u>Lessons commence at 8:50am</u>. Please ensure that your child is on time and ready for learning by this time. Students arriving after this time need to sign in or be signed in by their parent/caregiver at the school office before going to class. Please wear a mask when visiting the office.

Arrangements should be made for students to be collected from school at 3pm.

After school, students wait at the 'PE container' end of the car park (if it is not raining). Parents, please do not pick them up until you are well into our safe zone alongside the Whare. We do not want children moving across the carpark at this time. The car park is a potentially dangerous place for children, please do not ask your child to navigate their way across the car park to your car. Please drive slowly and safely around our car park, watching for children at all times.

If parents are picking up students for appointments during school hours, please send an email to the office and the classroom teacher to notify the pick up time. When you arrive, wear a mask, sign in at the office, and the office will phone your child's classroom teacher to send them to the office. Parents should not visit classrooms to collect students during the school day.

The gym is closed before and after school. The playgrounds are closed after school.

## Wearing masks:

We are at Orange on the Covid Protection Framework (CPF). Mask wearing at school is now optional but highly recommended as the best way to prevent the spread of covid. Our teachers will continue to mask up and we will have masks available in our classes for those students who prefer to wear one. We ask that parents and caregivers wear a mask when visiting classrooms, thanks. We are keeping our classrooms well ventilated for our students and providing hand sanitiser.

Our Code of Conduct: We have a Code of Conduct for all students in the Junior College. When all our students abide by the code it makes the school environment peaceful and safe for everyone. Please read through and discuss it with your child. Thanks for your support.

Fitness: On Thursday mornings, Years 4-6 will have fitness in the gym, followed by Years 1-3. All students from Years 1-6 will need to bring their PE gear on this day. House points will be awarded to the house that has the most members in correct gear.

Home learning: Students from Y1-3 will bring a junior reading book home each afternoon. It is important for students to read the book with you at home and return it to school the next day. Please ensure books are transported back to school in a book bag - this helps to keep our books in good condition. Students from Y4-6 may not necessarily bring assigned reading material home each night, however we do expect students to select Library books to read at home each night. Classroom teachers will let you know of their expectations regarding home learning for their students.

School uniform: Students are expected to wear the correct school uniform to school every day. However, if there is a need to send your child to school in non-regulation clothing or footwear then we ask that you provide a dated note of explanation to your child's teacher and we require that the situation is corrected as quickly as possible. This includes incorrect or lack of PE gear for PE lessons.

**School shoes**: Winter shoes for boys and girls must be black, polishable (leather look) velcro fastening or lace up. **Velcro fastening is prefered for Year 1-2 students**.

Please note: canvas shoes or fabric sneakers, e.g. converse or basketball style shoes or slip ons are not permitted. Boots are also not permitted.

Socks: Girls wear white or black socks and boys wear black socks.

Girls can wear black stockings, but please note that footless leggings under skirts or shorts are not permitted. Please name all uniform items - including footwear and socks.
