Honour

Indigenous studies and Māori cultural astronomy academic Professor Rangī Mātāmua (Ngāi Tūhoe) says that Matariki has three major elements which feed into the celebration. "One is to remember those that we've lost since the last rising of Matariki, so that's remembrance; two is celebrating who we are and our identity with food and coming together as family and sharing; and the last thing it's about planning for the future and looking forward to a new and bright future." Memory, celebration, and hope.

1 Corinthians 13:13 says, "Three things will last forever - faith, hope and love - and the greatest of these is love". (Na, tenei te mau nei te Whakapono, te Tumanako, te Aroha, enei e toru; ko te mea nui rawa ia o enei ko te Aroha.) Enjoy the Matariki celebration this weekend, as an opportunity to learn more about our bicultural heritage, and renew plans for the rest of 2022.

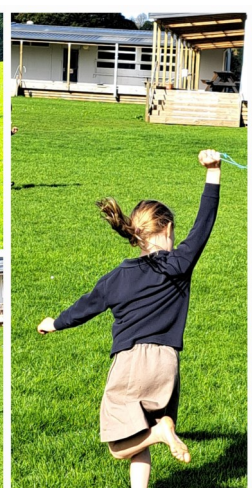
