Duke of Edinburgh—The Pinnacles

This week the Duke of Edinburgh bronze practice tramp was to the Pinnacles in Coromandel. The awesome group of students started the first day buzzing throughout the 4 hour drive from Whangarei to the Kauaeranga Valley just out of Thames. After a quick Pak n' Save stop we drove along an incredible valley road to our first campsite and set up our tents in the twilight before playing spotlight. The next day a storm was brewing and our goal was to make it to the hut and up to the summit of the Pinnacles before the storm really set in. The track was incredible with awesome suspension bridges, river crossings, beautiful scenery and some steep climbs.

At the hut, 582m above sea level and surrounded by incredible bush, we dropped our heavy packs and ate a quick lunch then headed up to the summit in the quickly worsening rain. The storm had settled so we ate breakfast, gathered our gear and left the safety of the hut into the chilly morning air and low hanging cloud. Turbo Touch Coaching
