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Student mid-year reports go home next week, with Learning Conferences in the first week of next term. School Carpark Closing for Concreting

We are pleased to announce that our carpark will soon be concreted. WCET * Follow the arrows to our court area at the back of the carpark will be starting this project during the school holidays, and into Term Three. * Pickup/drop-off zone is beside the gate to the courts

This means that our entrance driveway and carpark will be out of use. We are hopeful that this will only be for the first four weeks of Term Three (July 11 - August 22). For safety reasons, we ask our parents to not drop off children at our entrance during this time.
