



Year 8 Art—Migration Artworks

The Year 8 art class have been learning about migration. We have looked examples of migration in the bible from Abraham leaving his homeland to follow God, Moses and the Israelites leaving Egypt to Jesus and his parents going to Egypt to flee King Herod.

The students looked at examples of migration and connection to places in their own lives. They selected a central animal or object that they felt connected to, then put patterns and objects around the outside that represented places and cultures important to them. These artworks are made with Indian ink and coloured with dye.
