

Theological Framework Diagram


The diagram (right) illustrates the core beliefs and ideas represented in this theological framework and shows how they relate to and inform Christian education.

At the centre of the diagram we have our core beliefs about God and the implications of this for Christian education. In first ring we have Scripture, God's written

word to us, and our participation in Christ. **The second ring** represents the lenses of faith, hope and love, which are grounded in the gospel of Jesus Christ and inform all segments of the outer ring.

Around the outside the arrows connecting faith, hope, and love to the outer ring indicate a two-way relationship between our theology and our educational context.

2023 World Vision 40 Hour Famine Update

This year Excellere College's Year 7's to 13's participated in the World Vision 40 Hour Challenge, on the weekend of the 9th - 11th, fundraising for clean water resources in Malawi.

This involved each participant going for 40 hours without something, or limiting a necessity. Some ideas people completed were: no technology; 40hrs=40km run/ walk; 40hrs 40L; 40hrs no talking and more. Excellere's goal was to raise \$1000, which would provide 10 water pumps for children in Malawi. The online donations surpassed this goal, with \$2,675.99, the mufti day raised another \$399.70 and the



cash donations brought in \$570.00. This total raised was \$3,645.69.

A special mention to Rosie and June who both raised over \$400 each! June ran around the Whangarei Loop 8 times running a total of over 40km!
