Without income, Pasquella's parents could not afford education for her and her siblings, and had to rely on family and neighbours.

We can help people like Pasquella who are suffering the results of deforestation and climate change. We can equip a farmer to unlock underground, forests and regrow trees fast for only \$107 for a acre. So sign up for the 40 hour challenge and fundraise so we can create a change!



TRY-Challenge

The TRY-Challenege made it onto the calendar at the end of Term 1 and the kids LOVED it. The TRY-Challenge is an event that we started back in 2021 when Covid cancelled all of our inter school sporting events. I saw it as a fun way to get a bunch of kids active.

Traditionally the TRY-Challenge is a triathlon, but having this event at school makes us think outside of the box for a fun and challenging event for the kids to do. The first activity is a skipping and press up challenge. The students are expected to push themselves a little so that they are challenged in the strength department. Then they run outside to start the big obstacle course, some of the fun features are: the waterslide, colour run, cargo net, wet sponge throw, potato and spoon race while being hit with noodles, and many more activities. After students have navigated the obstacle course twice, they then set out on the run, which is about 1.5km and takes them through the paddocks to dodge the cow pats. On the finish line, everyone receives a medal and they are all given a Weetbix TRY Challenge t-shirt to compete in.

I couldn't put this event on without an excellent team. So firstly thank you to the staff who always go that extra mile for me.
