From the Principal

Teachers have been writing reports and students have been completing NCEA exams at Renew whilst the remainder have been assessed on their learning within school. We are evaluating the year and planning ahead for 2025 and beyond. The changes from government have continued at a tremendous pace and we have been doing our utmost to keep well ahead of them. Many staff are involved in training of the use of new teaching resources but we are determined to continue to use the established approaches alongside the new.



2024 Excellere Yearbook


