Student Attendance

The Ministry of Education has a strategy to improve student attendance across Aotearoa/ New Zealand. The goal is to have 80% of students attending school 90% or more of the time. At Excellere College our attendance data is among the best in the region. However, there is always room for improvement. It is interesting to note that when a student has 90% attendance they are actually absent from school for one day every two weeks. That is one full week's absence from school every term and a whole four weeks each year. Obviously, when a student is ill they must stay home but it has been proven that unnecessary absence can dramatically affect a young person's academic achievement.
