It seems unbelievable that we will be at the halfway mark of the school year at the end of this term. There is so much joy, faith and change happening within our school. We have welcomed many more new families and we look on gratefully at the progress DHS are making on the new classrooms. Despite the weather they are on target to have the buildings completed before the end of the year.

I wanted to take a moment to say how incredibly proud I am of Mrs Larissa Matheson and Teale Vint in their work on Showquest again this year. Our students were outstanding! Our senior performance was third and our junior group won the Te Tai Tokerau section for the second year in a row. This is such a wonderful way to showcase our Christian values in a secular setting. I often wonder how many lives are touched through this form of outreach.

Our school's student leaders attended a Leadership Summit in Auckland with the organisational prowess of Mrs Jeanne Hill with Mrs Meagan Kelly and Mrs Danielle Smith supporting her. The students reported that the activities and keynote speakers were amazing. We even received an email from a student from another school complimenting us on our incredible students!
