## From the Principal

Kia ora/Kamusta/haai/Annyeong haseyo Excellere College kaupapa whānau/families,

The blessings just keep on coming here at Excellere College. We took delivery of two new 12 seater school vans and this gives us so much more capacity for taking students out and about. Thank you so much to the School Board for investing the funds to make this happen. Our four new classrooms are progressing very well and we have been making plans for 2026 and beyond.



We are still receiving a large number of enrolment enquiries across most year levels. I wish to assure the Excellere community that we are managing the growth in a prayerful manner to protect our incredible Christian character. Our aim is to grow by 30 -40 students next year and again by a similar number in 2027.

As a part of the roll growth we are looking at additional subjects for senior classes for next year. Students have already submitted their subject choices and we are seeking to employ teachers to teach in those spaces. These are such exciting times! I am sure you will have seen huge changes to NCEA being announced in the media. Whilst the media is

light on details I can tell you that at Excellere College we will be making progress prayerfully and doing our best to keep you well informed along the way. The final draft of the Special Character Review has been submitted to the School Board and will be available for wider publication by the end of the term.



Our netball teams had their finals in the pouring rain and we are so proud of how well they did throughout the season. It is vital to acknowledge the selfless work of the coaches and managers who were tireless in their support of our students. Also, it is important to mention parents who turned up week after cold wet week to cheer the players from the side lines.

We had a number of teams taking part in the recent Mathex competition. Despite the fact that many teams were affected by illness they did incredibly well against tough competition from other schools. A huge "dankie" to everyone involved. Another recent event was the Digits of Pi challenge. Some of our students managed to recite Pi to nearly 200 places. This is an outstanding achievement.



Our senior students are working hard towards their internal exams and this is a great opportunity to revise subject content and refine exam technique. I think way back to my own days of sitting exams as a secondary student and I recall feeling anxious about the formal assessments. As Christians we are so blessed to be able to hand our burdens to Him.

### Learning about 'Challenge' in Room 7

Room 7 has been learning about our Term 3 topic of 'challenge' in a variety of ways. We have collaborated to work on Minecraft build challenges that align with our memory verse (Psalm 18:30-36). 






#### Senior School Ball

# Caylin Watkins—International Hip Hip Dance Competition



In July, I had the incredible opportunity to travel to Dubai for my first-ever international dance competition—World Supremacy Battlegrounds (WSB), a world-class hip hop event. I've been dancing for several years now, and this experience was a huge milestone for me and my team. We flew out on the 7th of July, with the competition running over four intense and unforgettable days—Thursday through Sunday. Dubai was insanely hot—the comp itself took place in 56°C heat because

the air conditioning failed, making it one of the toughest environments I've ever danced in. Crews from all over the world came to compete, including dancers from the Philippines, Nepal, South Africa, and China. In prelims, my team placed 5th and 8th in our separate divisions, and in the finals we placed 2nd and 4th—ranking us in the top five dance crews in the world in our categories. As a country, New Zealand placed second overall, just behind the Philippines. We also received several special awards including Best Crew, Most Creative, and Crowd Favourites. Through this journey, I've learned that dance isn't just about moves—it's a form of art, a way to express culture, emotion, and individuality. I even got to meet Tyler's choreographer and made amazing new friends, especially from Nepal and the Philippines. I'm proud of how far we've come, and I'm excited to keep learning new dance styles in my own time and to support my new friends as they continue their journeys too.
