HĀ Wānanga at Hihiaua Cultural Centre

On Thursday 6th November I was privileged to be a part of the Year 10 'HĀ' experience at Hihiaua Cultural Centre, facilitated by Justice Hetaraka and her amazing team.

After our initial introductions she went straight in to pūrākau (story telling) by delivering the creation story as seen through the Te Ao Māori lens, weaving whenua (earth) and all the elements of the whenua, such as oneone (soil/dirt), ngahere (forests), manu (birds), aitanga pepeke (insects).

She spoke of 'kōkōwai' the yellow ochre pigment, which when fired, became a reddish colour, and this was used as a base for paint when mixed with oil, specifically from different parts of the tohorā (whale). Depending which part of the tohorā the oil came from determined how and where it was used, for instance, one for strengthening structures, one for healing and yet another for good health. Justice encouraged us to look deeper and harder at our natural environment, how everything has a purpose, and is at our fingertips. The end result was to create our own interpretation of the creation story in booklet form using the 'kokowai' mixed with oil and water.

Finally we were treated to a lino print of 'Unaunahi', a local design which depicts certain times and space - a time line. E tino pai ana i tenei ra, i tenei wānanga hoki. Tau ke!

Reflection by Mishé Lotz: This year I learned how to use manual camera settings like aperture, shutter speed, and ISO to control light and exposure. I also developed my editing skills, learning how to enhance colour, contrast, and detail to bring my creative ideas to life.

Having the freedom to be creative was one of the most enjoyable parts of this project. I used Ms. Hale's hands as my model and incorporated paint to represent my main theme of nail polish, which made the photos both expressive and unique. Experimenting with different colours and textures was my favourite part, as it allowed me to create energy and emotion within my artwork.

Next year in Level 3 Photography, I want to get better at using lighting and editing to make my photos more interesting. My goal is to make my photos more creative and show my personality through my work.
