I want to thank everyone involved in the setting up of these beautiful new teaching spaces. The Whangārei Christian Education Trust (WCET) has done an incredible job. We are so grateful to them for their vision to further God's Kingdom.

I also wish to thank everyone for their understanding and flexibility in regards to the change to the early bus, especially in the afternoons. In James chapter 3 verses 3-12 it speaks about the power of the tongue.

3 Indeed, we put bits in horses' mouths that they may obey us, and we turn their whole body. 4 Look also at ships: although they are so large and are driven by fierce winds, they are turned by a very small rudder wherever the pilot desires. 5 Even so the tongue is a little member and boasts great things.

See how great a forest a little fire kindles! 6 And the tongue is a fire, a world of [b] iniquity. The tongue is so set among our members that it defiles the whole body, and sets on fire the course of [c] nature; and it is set on fire by [d] hell. 7 For every kind of beast and bird, of reptile and creature of the sea, is tamed and has been tamed by mankind. 8 But no man can tame the tongue. It is an unruly evil, full of deadly poison. 9 With it we bless our God and Father, and with it we curse men, who have been made in the [e] similitude of God. 10 Out of the same mouth proceed blessing and cursing. My brethren, these things ought not to be so. 11 Does a spring send forth fresh water and bitter from the same opening? 12 Can a fig tree, my brethren, bear olives, or a grapevine bear figs? [f] Thus no spring yields both salt water and fresh.

This is a great reminder to take care of the words that we speak and the power that they carry. I am especially challenged by the first sentence in verse 10, Out of the same mouth proceed blessing and cursing.

My invitation to us all is to pray first and lean into Him in the good times and in the more challenging seasons. Combine this with gratitude and we have a healthy start to 2026 here at Excellere College.

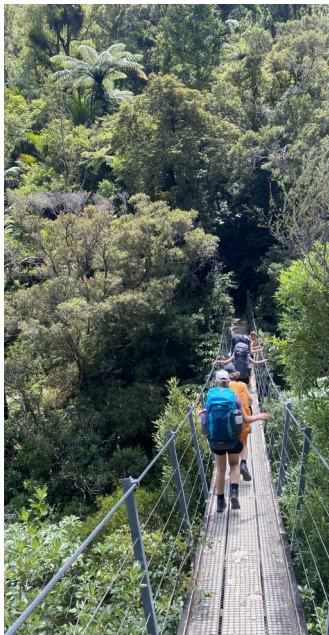
Duke of Edinburgh— Bronze Pinnacles Hike
